April Sunday

22 Left Otoe City passed thro Nebraska City and Moved out 6 miles & campd Mater plenty -- no wood & grass very scarce

Monday 23 Traveled over rolling country and camp^d on a small stream Wood, Water plenty grass short made 12 ms.

A Tuesd 24 In 10 m^S Crossed Salt Creek on a Bridge Took Wood & moved out 4 m^S and Camp^d Water & Grass scarce

Wednesday 25 Noved 15 ms over rolling country a few trees in sight once camp^d on a small slough Wood & Grass scarce,

Thursday 26 Started early and traveled all day over a rolling country following the dividing Ridge Stoped one hour at noon and at 5 1/2 P.M. Camped in a grassy ravine to the left traveled 11 hours & made 22m. Wood none - Grass tolerable & Water plenty

Friday 27 traveled 10 Miles over a high level table land
then a mile of abrupt rolling country to the Valey of XNE Big
Platte - here we found a small stream of Water & in 4 Miles came
to Elm Creet. Both these streams have timber on them in the hills
but none in the Bottom No Wood or Grass Bot Mar for feed Water
plenty Made 15 Ms

Saturday 25 Up the Bottom 5 Miles over level road then 4
Miles over bad Sandy Road to the lower bottom Came 3 Miles to
Clear Creek and camped Wood & Grass scarce Water plenty &
Very fine - to day was very windy In crossing the Creek on a log
several of the boys fell in -- Made 12 ms

Sunday 29 Started early & traveled up Clear Creek 2 or 3 miles the Road Today was sometimes Sandy sometimes hard but tolerably good -- Grass all day scarce we only intended to go 10 ms but could find no camp until 16 miles Campd on the bank of the River. Grass fair Wood & Water plenty 110

Monday 30 'Moved on up the Valley in 10 Miles passed a trading post a Sod house and in 4 Miles another in a Tent, nooned or rather rested as we had no Grass -- found no Grass all day & had to camp on the Bank of the River 1 1/2 ms from the road on very short grass -- Wood and Water plenty -- Made today 20 Miles -

May 1st Tuesday Traveled 5 hours this A.M. over level & tolerably good Roads no grass in sight. Hamilton & Co left bound ahead for grass P.M. traveled 4 hours & Camp on the bank of the River got plenty of Wood from an Island near & had poor Grass Made today 16 ms

Wednesday 2^d Started early & in 4 miles left the Bottom & came 4 ms over the upland to the River bottom again and nooned on tolerable grass & at 4 1/2 P.M. camped 1 1/2 mile from the Road on the bank of the River Good Tood from Island Grass tolerable Lade 20 m⁸

Thursday 3 Started at 6 1/4 A M and triveled till 12 1/2 and nooned on Good Grass and at 2 p.m. moved on -- Road all day up the Valey which was very wide. Saw several trains on the St. Jo road coming into the Valey at 5 P.M. camped 1 m. from the Road on the bank of the river found Good Grass on the Island

Friday 4th Started early and in 13 Miles came to Ft.

Kearny - passing on the way several Whisky shops alias ranches

From Ft. K. we turned North & in 1 mile came to Platte River

and met with Hamilton - We immediately started across Platte

River there are 10 channells; big & little two very wide & so

deep we had to raise up our Loading & double teams - Wading &

driving it took us over two hours to cross about 2 Miles wide

We camped on the north bank - Grass Good - Wood on the Islands

Water too much Made Today 16 miles

Sat. 5th A. M. laid by aired our load dried our Maggon beds & wrote letters &c. P.M. we moved up the River and in 6 Miles camp^d on the bank. Wood & grass good Made today 6 Miles 208

Sunday 6 Started at 11 A.M. intending to go 5 or 6 K^S but found no camp until sunset & that a poor one on the bank of a slough with no grass - a little wood & Water plenty. Made today 15 ms. Our road to day has been over dry barren level Prairie at a long distance from the river.

* Monday 7 As we had no grass for our stock we were off by sunrise intending to camp at the first grass & Water But our road like yesterday was from 4 to 5 ms from the river 2 Crossed 2 Creek beds where wood was plenty but no grass & in the 2^d no water - or grass So on we rolled - the Mule & Horse team out of sight ahead - a little before sunset - seeing no better prospect ahead & not knowing where the other teams were we turned for the river & a little after dusk came to a slough with water and camped Grass tolerable - No tood - Tind very high from N.W. made a dry supper on Grackers Cold mont & water & went to bed Fade to day 25 ms traveled 14 hours 251

Tuesday & The wind was very high all night & at 2 or 3 A.M. it began to rain which soon turned into snow & it was rain and snow till 9 A.M. Very hard -- Very Gold as we had no fire in Camp it was cheerless enough we spent our time in the Waggons wraped up in Blankets & Quilts - and in an occasional run after the cattle -- Breakfast was rather a dry performance about noon we hooked up and moved on about 8 miles & came to the Eule & Horse teams & lay up the remainder of the day 259

Wednesday 9 Wind high and directly against us all day Moved up the Valley 4 or 5 miles near river & then we left the River at noon we stoped 1 hour on good Grass P.K. Loved on & in 7 miles came to the River where it comes close to the Bluffs the last 3 miles road was very sandy & heavy -- Camped on a narrow bottom Day pleasant except the Wind Willow wood plenty Water plenty - Grass tolerable Made today 15 miles

Thursday 10 Hamilton had moved further up the River than us last eve - Moved on up the Valley Most of the road good with occasionally some sand Bottoms wide & tolerably good at 11 1/2 came to H- camp & found good Grass plenty of Water no wood 288 Here we laid by for the day made 11 miles

Friday 11 Started early & soon crossed skunk creek and for the next 10 m had mud - sloughs - & sand a very heavy road 7 ms from Skunk Crk passed a big spring of clear pretty waterbut not very good nooned 4 ms from the Spring on Carrion Crk P.M. Roads for & ms tolerably good then for 2 miles bad crossing several bad sloughs - and campd on the bank of a creek 1 rod wide Grass scarce very no wood - lade today

Saturday 12 As we had no grass last night we were off by 6 A.M. & in 1/2 mile broke the tongue to our Horse was n In half an hour we had it mended - good as new & moved on and in the next 3 miles crossed about a dozen deep miry sloughs and all the road was deep heavy dragging Then for 6 miles the road was better - nooned on the bank of N. Platte. P.M. Good roads close to the river for 4 miles to Sand Creek 2 Rods wide good crossing here we left the river and took round thro the Bluff 3 miles of deep sandy Road to the River bottom again where we found tolerable grass - Water in some Ponds not very good no wood Yesterday & today we passed several large snow banks But the weather is werm lade 16 miles

13 Rain & very cold all day. Laid by

Monday 14 Started early and at first had good road in

3 m^S left the River & struck over the Hills roads very heavy on
account of deep sand for 2 Ms -- then good roads for 2xXxx a
short distance & so it was all day a little good road and then as
much deep sand Crossed several small streams and camp on good
grass on a slough Made today 16 Miles

Tuesday 15 Started early and found the roads much better being mostly hard & dry & but little sand during the day we crossed several small streams most of them coming from springs at the foot of the Bluffs on all of these we found good grass & some pieces of excellent land stoped to noon near the Bluffs at 12 1/2 P.M. found the roads generally good - but occasionally a few rods of deep sand. Camp^d at 5 1/2 P.M. on a slough near the river No wood - Chips scarce & Grass only tolerable.

Nade today 20 ms.

Wed 16 Started early & in 1/2 m left the River & crossed over a point of the Bluffs - This was all deep sand - the hardest pull we have had. up & down we had it nearly a mile - then we came to the bottom & had good roads til noon at 11 A.M. passed Ash Hollow & campd for noon on a creek 2 ms above -- P.M. after resting 3/4 hour we started in 1/2 m J Todds child fell out of the waggon & the wheel run over its leg not seriously hurt. Road good till sunset Jane Slusher was thrown from a horse & hurt - not bad - Road all P.M. was over high bottom dry & no grass bottoms generally on fire Dark came on us; No Grass -No Rule Waggon in sight in front but after a time we saw the Camp Lantern & at 9 P.M. got in all safe all tired all hungry & no one in a very good humor Camp on the bank of the River -Chips scarce Grass slim - by 10 1/2 we had Supper over & turned in to our Blankets Several went to bed without supper l'ade today 28 ms. 388

Thursday 17 Started at & A M after Doctoring 2 or 3 oxen moved up the River 5 (5) miles & stoped to rest at 11 A M. on tolerable grass on the Bank of the River P.M. Started at 1 & traveled until 5 1/2 and Camped on the bank of the River Grass tolerable - Water plenty no wood except a little small sage brush & a very few Euffalo- Chips Road today has been mostly hard & gravely with occasionally a few Rods of Sand -- Made 401 Miles

Friday 18 Started at 6 1/2 A M & in 1 mile left the river and went about a mile thro the Bluffs. The Hills ascending were not bad: being dry & very hard but the descent was thro deep sand & very heavy pulling -- The[n] we entered the bottom again & had good roads for 3 miles then for 5 Miles road principally sandy & heavy - Mooned on the bank of the River - the first place we have come to it for & Miles - Grass short 4 Ms. back came in sight of "Courthouse Rock" and camp for noon in sight of "Chimney Rock" (Lule & horse teams ahead) P.M. Started at 1 1/2 and found the Roads sometimes good & sometimes sandy in 2 1/2 H overhauled the other Teams in Camp & all moved on over an open bottom of Sand & Gravel dry & with no grass - there was no low bottom & of course no chance to stop at 5 1/2 we left the bottom but came to it again in 3/4 Kile thro deep sand -& at 6 1/2 Campd on Bank of River - Grass Tolerable No wood -Lade today 18 m5-419

Saturday 19 Started early & had good roads over high bottom. These higher bottoms are covered with a short very thick coat of grass that stock will not touch. In 10 miles we came to the river and nooned on short grass no wood.

P.M. rolled on over good roads at 3 P.M. reliad representational problem it clouded up & soon begin to rain & hail the mule & horse teams had to stop & by the time the ox teams came up the worst was over & we moved down onto the bank of the river & camp^d grass short - Got some Tillows from an island for wood. Rade today 16 Miles.

Sunday 20 It was clear before sunset last evening & the night was clear & cold - Started in good season & had good roads The wind was very high & directly against us & very cool. Stoped at 11 A.M. on tolerable grass on the Bank of the River Chimney rock is in fair view yet below - & Scotts Bluff a short distance above. No wood Made & Ms Laid by for the day

Monday 21 Started in good season Day pleasant & Road level & hard - Good - The road lay across a high bottom with no grass & some distance from the river at 10 A.M. passed opposite

Scotts Bluff and at 12 M. stoped to noon at the first place we came to the River at the mouth of a small clear stream Grass short. P.M. traveled up the small stream till we passed when it heads in a large Marsh Most of the way 2 or 3 M. from the River having traveled about 2 Ms. & seeing nothing of our Horse & Mule team - we struck off for the river & at 6 1/2 camp^d on the bank - Grass very short plenty willow wood (at 3 P.M. lost sight of Chimney Rock) Made today 15 Miles

Tuesday 22 Started early & moved up the bottom 6 ms & found the other teams - & stoped 2 or 3 hours on tolerable grass - then moved on 4 miles & found Good grass & camped for the day Road to day good Grass generally scarce Rade 10 miles 471

Wednesday 23^d Started early in 1/21. met a train from Salt Lake road soon left the river and did not strike it for several miles - road mostly Good - Came to the River at 12 M. & nooned on short grass. Horse & Mule teams out of sight ahead after short rest we moved on & soon struck into a deep sandy road this made heavy dragging & our progress was slow at 6 3/4 F.M. as we could see nothing of the other teams we

turned square to the River 1 II. distant and found good grass.

Wood in abundance & all Platte River for Watering Made today

19 m9

Thursday 24 Started early & found the road mostly deep heavy sand. The Mule & Horse teams had camp^d 1 1/2 m^S above us - In 6 Miles we came to Platte River opposite to Fort Laramie & Camp^d one Mile above Laid by for the rest of the Day & tried to get over to the fort Post Office but could not, 497

Friday 25 After a fruitless attempt to get over the river we gave our Letters to some men who were going to swim their horses over. & started at 7 A M. In 8 Ms we took to the Black hills roads very rough & rocky at 2 P.M. we stoped an hour to noon at a large spring to the right of the road 11 Ms after our Rest we moved on up hill & down over some very bad road 6 Miles to the bank of the Platte - a nice bottom with good grass & Wood Made 17 Ms.

Saturday 26 Did not move camp Washed & fixed up

Sunday 27 Started early and had good roads - for the Black

Hills - Gradually ascending for 7 miles Then down a steep rocky

hill into a wide hollow (or valley) and good roads again

generally with 2 or Frocky & rough descents - we followed down

the Hollow about 3 Miles - to a spring an[d] grove of Box Elder

& nooned Grass & water Good F.M. followed down the Branch

1/2 M & then took to the upland on our right & had 3 1/2 ms of

good road over rolling prairie to a small creek with some grass

and Water Crossing this we traveled over the upland 2 m to Deep

Creek where we found tolerable grass & good water but no wood,

but sage Camped - Made 16 m

Fonday 28 Last night it stormed & rained very hard & this A.M. the rain continued with a very cold North Wind & some Snow So we could not move About 2 1/2 P.M. the rain ceased & the weather moderated the High hills around were white with snow As we could not make the next camping place we did not move camp.

Tuesday 29 Started at 7 A.M. and had fine road except they were somewhat heavy on account of yesterday's Rain. roads ascended gradually over rolling country for about 6 ms when we struck the head of a Hollow & followed down it good roads for 4 ms to the River & stoped for noon the last mile of the ravine was well lined with box Elder - Willow & Cotton wood timber - found no Grass for noon 30 & wt plenty P.M. we left the Bottom & in 1/2 n came to the river & a large bottom across this 2 ms & crossed a ridge on to a large dry creek well lined with cottonwood & Box Elder Met Mormon oxtrain from Salt L. Then we struck across the bottom towards the River & followed up the Bottom 4 1/2 ms and campd on the River Bank 1/2 M from the road & found Nood & Water plenty & tolerable Grass - Made today 17 ms 547

Wednesday 30 Started at 7 A.M. and followed the road over high rolling barren bottom the River much of the time in sight in 7 miles we crossed a deep wash where the road was Sandy-Gravelly Clayey & Rocky & rough out of this we came in 1/2 M onto the River Bottom again wide rolling - Gavelly & barren & in 1 1/2 Ms nooned on a small patch of tolerable Grass P.M. Hoved up the Valley roads tolerable for 5 m when we left the river & soon ascended a ragged hollow & up & then down a steep rocky hill - then we turned down a hollow to the tolerable river

bottom & Campd on the Bank of the River near a small grove of Cottonwood Wd & Water plenty Grass tolerable Fade 14 ms 567

Thursday 31st Started early & soon left the bottom up the bed of a dry branch & then took to the hills rough, broken, steep, sidling, rocky, for 4 Kiles when we descended to the river bottom again & in 2 K crossed the bed of a dry branch then for 2 1/2 K over good bottom road to another dry branch skirted with a little timber several fine springs just below the road nooned P.K. moved on up the valley one mile & then took up the hill onto a kind of upper bottom traveled this P.K. 7 miles sometimes on high rolling bottom sometimes low and flat - but all the way barren & nearly destitute of grass. the principal part of Platte river bottom from Laramie to this point is covered with sage Greeswood & Cactus - and Grass is only found in occasional narrow strips close to the river bank road this P.K. mostly hard & good but sometimes sandy Kade today 14 Kiles 575

June 1st Friday After 6 or 7 miles of the same road as yesterday we descended a long sandy hill to the low bottom and followed
up it on good road 2 Miles to Bissonetts Ferry at the mouth of
Deer Creek here we left the river and had a mile & 1/2 over a
very high & bad hill to the bottom again - & in 1/2 M campd
P.M. Hamilton got a Mule shod - Slushers traded their 4 Moke oxen
& Match & saddle for 4 ponies & harness & we traded two Bay Horses
for 2 yk of Slushers Oxen this finished the day Made today
10 miles

A Saturday 2 Had our own fun geting off with the new teams but were off in good season road good along the low bottom till near noon when we went over a hill & into the bottom again P.M. Hoad soon left the Bottom & went over the upland sandy & gravelly - bad Roads with one or 2 bad hills - Crossed one or 2 dry branches and campd on the bank of the River Wd & It Plenty Grass poor Made 17 Miles

Sunday 3 Started in Good season and traveled over bad roads 4 Ms to the upper bridge & halted for a little time & bot an ox and moved on up the bottom 4 miles over bad roads hilly Sandy & Gravelly - and nooned on the bank of the river Grass all the way poor P.M. Moved up the river on the same kind of roads 6 Ms when we left it & took over a small hill to a small creek coming from the West Up this we traveled 1/2 M & Campd Wood Willows Grass scarce & Water good Made today 15 Ms

Honday 4 Started in good season & traveled over rolling sage & grease Wood Country with fine roads noticed a great deal of Wild Appliek - no grass in sight in 7 miles came to some rough rocky country but the road thro it was good. In 9 miles came to a small stream of brackish water some of our cattle drank freely of it without apparent injury in 12 hs we stoped to noon on the Branch coming from Willow Spring & 2 m below the Spring Water good Grass tolerable P.M. 2 hs up the ravine to Willow Springs then up a long hill good road the descent was easy in 2 hs from Willow Spring we came onto a small branch heading near the road here finding Water & tolerable grass we campd. Sage for Wood Made today 16 hiles.

Tuesday 5 Last night it began raining before midnight & was showery all night and about 10 1/2 the Horses & Mules (over 100) belonging to a train in Camp 1/2 Kile below us stampeeded & came by our Camp & within 20 yards of us & our stock at full speed - directly came the men some on horse back & some afoot in full chase with an awful clatter. Shortly after daylight they came back having secured all their runaways. About daylight it set in a steady rain which continued all forenoon with a cold wind from the North. Camp did not move until 1 oclock P.H. when it had cleared up and we set off Moved down the branch & in 2 Miles crossed a small stream running eastward then in 3 ms we came to a small stream on the left of . the road (to us) & traveled down it about a mile then in about . 2 ms we came to Horse (or Greasewood) Creek & in in one mile turned to the left and Campd on its bank 1/2 lile from the road grass tolerable -- Sagebrush plenty Water good. Fade today 10 ms

Wednesday 6 Started in good season & in 5 miles over level country came to a "flat" covered here & there with Alkali Ponds. passing over a point of higher sandy Land we came down into another similar flat & in 4 Miles came to Sweet Water River (one mile below Independance Rock) at a Mail Station & Bridge here nooned & had some Mules & an Cx shod P.M. crossed the River by the Bridge (at 25 cts pr Waggon) and traveled up a tolerably level bottom & miles to the Devils Gate just above this we caudd on the bank of the River. Grass tolerably good.

Cedar Tood on the Mountains near another family joined our train

Thursday 7 This Morning about 2 A.M. the Pony Express passed bound down under whip & spur Camp did not move today we as have have bad news from ahead as to Indians &c and have concluded to wait or travel slowly till we get a larger company U S Mail-down-passed Today.

Friday 8 Drove up the River one Mile & campd again Moved merely to have a fresh Camp. Nearly all of our Cattle
were sick yesterday & most of them vomited their Sickness
began with frothing at the mouth and every sign of pain in the
stomache and the Sickest vomited up what was in their first
stomach and soon got better I exemined the matter thrown up
and found a great deal of the dry twigs of the Greasewood
mingled with grass & c - and am satisfied the dry prickley
twigs of the Greasewood caused the trouble One man physicked his
ox with Bacon - which soon relieved him - the rest of us did
nothing for our cattle. To day all are well again the some of
them look a little the worse for it. Campd on good grass.
Made today 1 Mile

Saturday 9 Camp did not move today Weather clear-cloudy Hot-Warm-Cold by Spells with violent wind squalls.

Sunday 10 Moved 2 Miles up the Creek for the sake of

fresh Camp - crossed a small Branch No 3 found Good grass Wood

on the Mountain on the North side of the river Weather Cold
Warm- Clear & Cloudy with Wind & Rain squalls queer weather

for this country Made 2 Miles

June

Monday 11 Camp did not move about noon a Train of 14 Waggons came by & 5 of our Teams pulled out with them leaving only

Hamiltons & our Croud alone here - about the same time a train

of 6 ox waggons came passed the Devils Gate & lay by for the rest

of the day - as they are going our road in we made arrangements

to go on with them tomorrow -

Tuesday 12 About & A.M. the train from below came in sight & we pulled out Kept up the river & near it in 4 I's No 4 crossed a branch bad crossing & in 3 I's came to the river again and stoped to noon P.H. (in 1/2 Nile above Camp River passed thro a Spur of the Mountain) in one Nile passed round a spur of Mt & for near a mile was away from the river in 3 Ms Crossed a branch Good and Campa early on the bank of the river where it runs near a high bald rocky ridge on the side opposite from us last 6 Ms we traveled near the River Made today 14 Ms

Wednesday 13 Started early and in 4 Niles left the river & round a Spur of the Mountains and was not close to the river for & Miles when we came to the first ford of the 3 Crossings nooned the roads this A.M. were good - except a few small sandy hills. P.M. as the 2^d & 3^d crossings are impassable we have had to leave the river keeping up on the South Side first 2 miles were very deep heavy sand - then got out of the hills & found Tolerable roads & in 3 Miles care to the regular road up the South Side of the river & in 2 Miles came to the river & Camped Grass good Sage & Chips for wood for the last 5 Miles the road has been within a mile of the River Made 19 ms 699

Thursday 14 Started early (left Latshaw: Todd-Johnston Shusher &c in camp 1/4 m below us) the road soon left the river a considerable distance in 4 Miles came into the old Road and followed it the rest of the day during the forenoon crossed several low wet pieces of Land wher was tolerable swamp, Grass but no water after traveling 14 Kiles we came to a small stream to the left of the road here the road forks one road continues up the South side all the way the other crosses the river several times Nooned - GSS good P.M. traveled 5 Miles (Going down 2 large hills) and crossed Sweetwater good crossing then the road left the river and over a long stony hill 3 miles to the river again immediately it left the river and up & down a very steep hill and one mile to the river again where we campd - Grass Good Sage & Chips for Wd Fade today 23 Miles 722

Friday 15 Started early and moved up the River 4 miles then turned up a Hollow to the right and in 2 Miles of a long ascent got to the top of the Bluff & went down again & again climbed to the top then had 2 Miles of very rough rocky road then in 1/2 Mile of smoother road we found a little water on the left of the road with abundance of good grass - the road today when not rocky was very hard & gravely & very bad on the exensite feet - P.M. traveled over rolling country in 3 miles passed a fine spring to the left crossed several small streams of fine water - the upland was very rocky but the road much better than this forenoon did not come very near the river and campd on a Branch of Sweetwater one rod wide & 10 inches deep Grass tolerable plenty of willows for wood. There are large snewbanks all along 740

Saturday 16 Started early crossed the Branch and up a considerable Hill & in 2 liles over hard road came to Willow Creek 1 rod wide & 10 inches deep good crossing - then 4 1/2 ms over good road and rolling country and campd for the rest of the day on Sweetwater 1/2 Lile below the last Crossing of this river - laid by to have oxen &c shod as many of the cattle are very tender footed from Yesterdays bad road Made today 7 Miles

Sunday 17 Yesterday evening & this morning was very cold & windy & disagreable and camp is all out of humor - some want to push on as we are, some want to lay by for more force - some dont care a straw &c. Afew days ago we elected 6 captains 2 to serve a day now that arrangement dont suit and after a long jaw we concluded to elect one by secret ballot & obey him J Hamilton was elected & immediately gave orders to hook up & roll out - Crossing the creek we traveled over rolling country 10 Liles gravelly Roads to the Summit of the South Pass then Out of Mebraska Territory & into the State of Oregon in 3 Liles good descending road came to Pacific Springs & kept down the branch one Lile & campd Water & Grass plenty

Monday 18 Started in good season (Davis⁵ Train 22 Morses & 23 Mules joined us intending to travel with us thru the Indian Country! In 1/2 Mile crossed the Branch and travled 10 miles over Sandy-Sage Country to Dry Sandy & Mooned - a little water very little Grass - P.M. moved down West Side of Dry Sandy all afternoon over good roads a barren level Sandy Sage Covered Country - Road level and menerally free

from Rocks and Gravel - about 5 1/2 P.M. we left the road for 1/2 Mile and Camped on the bank of Little Sandy a short distance above when the road strikes it traveled this evening to 11 Ms Grass only tolerable - Willows & Sage plenty for Wood Made today 21 Miles 782

Little Sandy 2 1/2 Rods wide & 2 ft deep Good Crossing and traveled down the Creek from 1 to 2 Hiles from it over level Sandy Sage Country Roads good - In 8 miles we came to Big Sandy and followed down it 2 Hiles and forded it 4 Rods wide and 1 to 2 feet deep and directly stoped to noon Grass Good. there is occasionally a Cottonwood tree in sight along this stream but it is generally destitute of timber even of Willows F.M. traveled over the same kind of Country as this forenoon but more gravelly & stony - Cur course S.S.W.-down Big Sandy but distant from it from 1 to 3 Hiles - After traveling 10 Miles we came near to the Creek & turned off & Campd on its Eank 1/2 Hile from the road Grass Scarce - Willows and Sage for wood in plenty Made today 20 Miles -

Wednesday 20 Started at 7 A.M. and moved down the Creek & Some 1 or 3 miles from it the first 5 Miles was very Gravelly & Rocky when we descended into a broad alkali Bottom or flat across this about 5 Miles we came onto the bank of the Creek again and stoped for Moon Grass tolerable P.M. traveled down the Creek road Dry dusty sandy & not bad were nearer the creek than this morning - Came 9 Miles to Green River and ferried our Waggons across & swan our oxen in 1/2 an hour we were all across and moved down the river 1/2 Ms. and camped late - Grass Good Timber plenty Made today 19 Miles

June

Thursday, 21. Yesterday the Horse train in our Company stoped in Camp 2 1/2 or 3 Hiles from the ferry - on Big Sandy This Morning we shod some Cattle and when the Horse train came we hooked up and went up to the Ferry - Here was considerable wrangling some wanting to go via Salt Lake & some by Soda. Spring at last we concluded to move up the River on the Soda Spring route a mile az or two & noon on the first Grass and consult So we moved up 2 1/2 Miles & nooned - 1& jawed & debated 4 or 5 Waggons soon decided on the Salt Lake route & pulled out - the rest talked half an hour longer & followed suit we mooved down Green River about 5 or 6 Hiles below the Ferry and found a ranch and then the Road left the River & there was no grass or Water for 20 Miles - So we had to Stop - But there was no Wood or Grass in sight and so right about we turned and rattled back up the river a mile or so and Campd Grass good but very scattering and not fit to camp on Very small Sage & a few Chips for Tood - and now we are as undecided as ever the French trader below recomends the Soda Spring route and gives plausable reasons for it - hearly every one of the party who has been over the Plains approves it --& I dont know which way we will go tomorrow -- The Lost Day --

Friday 22 Last evening all was turmoil & confusion in Camp All kinds of opinions were expressed & debated This Morning we hooked up horse train and all and moved up the river 5 Miles to the Ferry There Morgan Fisher & Wife stoped in Mos.] to take passage in the Coach - Also Dr [Mank A Wife & team

Softer & better in 1 mile More Camp^d on river bank Grass Good

Nood plenty Made Today 14 Miles

Saturday 23 We camped last night just below the Ferry on the old Minney Cut off Started at 7 1/2 and for the first mile had very rocky Gravelly rough road then the road was level & smooth in 3 Miles we began to leave the river & had 5 miles we had rolling rocky country and hard roads & miles from the Old Ferry we came to a small stream on our right & stoped for noon very little grass P.M. followed up the branch about 2 Miles and them took to a low flat ridge to the left and had fine roads gradually ascending in 6 Miles we came down a long hill to a small branch - no grass - apeross this we took up another divide and followed a long level ridge over good roads and in 8 Miles came down a long hill to a fine Spring on our Right and small branch on our left here was plenty of Grass and water and large Sage Brush for Wood Made today 22 miles

Sunday 24 Started at 7 A.M. and took up a flat ridge
Testward - in 3 1/2 Miles came to the foot of a range of
runing
hills Funning N. & S. turned to the left up these along stony
ascent but not steep & in im 2 Miles came to the top and soon
began the descent first down a steep descent then up a very
steep rocky pull - then down a long steep descent to a small
creek across this we moved west over a low divide Sometimes

very rocky to the Valley of another small stream 1 1/2 Miles down this Stream to the South we turned crossing 2 nice brooks & several gullies & stoped to noon, at a nice spring & grove of Aspen on our Right - 10 m.

P.M. Moved down the Valley over a succession of Ridges & gullies some bad to cross - In 4 miles left the Old road (which crosses the ridge on our right) and Kept on over low ridges and hollows 4 Mils to Hams Fork of Green R and Camped, (Came down a very rocky hill to Hams Fk) Willows plenty Grass very good Made 18 Miles 876

Monday 25 Had quite a hard rain for an hour after we Camp^d yesterday evening afterwards it cleared up but was very Cold and this Morning was a very heavy frost. But the Sun rose clear and soon it was warm enough to go without Coat or Vest. Moved 1 1/2 Miles up the Creek and forded without trouble Soon we pulled up a short steep ascent and then a Mile of level road then up a long steep ascent the last part very steep sidling and rocky -- this is the worst pull up the Bear River Mountain - we then had about 5 Miles of good road mostly ascending to a Grove of Aspen and large Spring here we nooned; Grass & Water good P.M. Still climbing the Mt. we had gradually ascending and good road for 3 miles then we began a steeper ascent thro a grove of Fir Timber and still ascending to the top Then began the descent steep-rocky-

sidling-dusty and bad generally - at the foot of the

Mountain we came to a small rocky stream called Mud

Creek here we camped Grass tolerable Willow & Sage

plenty. Made today 14 Miles - 690

Tuesday 26 Started in good season ascended a hill for a mile then began the descent steep but good for the first pitch then rocky & rough & very steep for a long descent then better & worse the whole descent one mile Once down we had good road over gently rolling country 5 Miles to a spring Branch down this 1/2 Mile & we nooned Grass excellent Water good P.M. Moved down Bear River Bottom which we entered here 4 Miles over good level road to Smiths Fork 4 Rods wide which we crossed at a new crossing above the Old Bridge. The ford was very rapid and so deep we had to block up some of our Jaggons All got over safe. kept on down the valley about 2 miles and came onto Bear River where it passes thro a very narrow bottom. Just below this we passed a village of Shoshones 2 miles below we camped near the River Grass excellent Willows & Chips for wood Made today 15 Miles 905

Wednesday 27 Started in good season moved down the Valley 1/2 Lile we cam to a small hudy branch which was bad to cross -- In 3 liles we left the river and made a long circuit round a large bottom which was full of sloughs and came onto Tomasen fork 3 or 4 miles above its mouth and crossed it at a good ford 3 rods wide and 1 1/2 feet

Deep gravelly bottom and in 1/2 Lile stoped to noon

Grass excellent -- P.M. moved down towards Bear River one mile and then turned to the right over a high mountain the ascent was long in places Sidling & sometimes steep the Descent was steep rought and rocky - Down the hill in 1/2 mile crossed a miry branch and followed down it 1/2 mile between two high hills - to a narrow valley thro which run a fine gravelly bottomed branch towards Bear river -Then we climbed a very steep high Mountain there was no shunning it After geting fairly up we crossed a rocky ridge and descended a steep hill into a narrow ravine we followed down this a short distance and then took up another the Upper end of this was steep-rocky and very narrow from here we still kept climbing up & up till we came to the jumping off place the going down was all at once steep rough & rocky we locked with both hinder wheels and got down by hard work and campa at 1/2 mile at a spring in the bottom. Water poor & not plentiful Wood (Sage & Chips) Scarce Grass plenty & Excellent Fade today 921 16 miles

Thursday 26 Started at the usual hour and pulled over a low ridge one mile to the river bottom in 3 miles we came on to the bank of a slough and about 300 yards from the river we then left the river and had good level road 5 Miles to a Branch 1 rod wide & 6 inches deep Good crossing here we nooned Grass very fine and abundant. Wood & Water plenty P.M. Moved on down the Valley Roads good all afternoon level and hard in 6 Miles Crossed a branch and in a Mile crossed 2 More all fine water with plenty of Willows

in 2 Miles crossed another similar stream and in 2 Miles crossed a larger Stream 1 rod wide gravelly bottom at two crossings - here we campd Grass abundant - Water good Millows & Chips for Wood plenty Made today 19 Miles 940

Friday 29 Started early and in one Mile entered "the Bluffs" a place where the road leaves the river bottom thro the bluffs was about 2 1/2 Miles of rough road up and down sidling and bad generally we then came out onto an open bottom or what was in the place of bottom a rolling country formed by a succession of ridges puting down from the Mounts to the river - during the A.M. crossed 2 or 3 small streams and nooned near the river on good grass 1/2 Miles to the left of the road F.M. had ridgy road and occasionally rocky for 2 Miles then it was more level but some times rocky in 7 Liles we came to Soda Springs and crossed the 3 Branches without trouble and Camed 2 Hiles below on the Bank of Bear River fine Grass-Wood plenty on the mountains 960 near Made today 20 Miles Saturday

Today we laid by - As yesterday we found a notice to Emigrants Warning us of danger ahead and notifying us that an escort of Dragoons would be furnished to those trains that desired it. The notice was signed "Leut Horris 2" Drag" - said escort would leave this place every 10 Days - and guard trains as far as "Gity of Rocks" about 125 ms. That the Danger is we don't know - but will

send over to Drag- Camp tomorrow to find out - Spent the day Cleaning up fishing &c &c

July 1st Sunday Still we lay by waiting for something to turn up. Six of our Party went ahead this Morning and at the forks of the road found another notice similar to the one we saw that the Soda Springs and in addition it stated it was 60 Miles to the Camp of the Drag - So they came back and we will have to lay here until the 5th unless more trains come up making us strong enough to go through without the Escort.

Monday 2d Still in the same camp - spend the time fishing & washing &c &c A.M. Cloudy & Clear F.M. A little rain & Cloudy & Cool

Tuesday 3 Still laying by patiently and as good humoredly as we can 2 Waggons & 6 horses with 2 whites & an Indian, from Salt Lake, came up while we were at breakfast Bound to Soda Springs - so they say They give us no information & after resting an hour or so moved on.

Mednesday 4th The Fourth of July 10 years ago today

I was on the Plains on my way to Oregon but more than 450 nearer
the Mo. River than I am now I was in the Black Hills about

50 miles west of Ft Laramie - and was at this place about
the 11 or 12th August 6 years ago yesterday I passed here
on my way home from California -- Now we have been laying
this makes 5 Days waiting for an Escort to take us thro

the Hostile Indians &c Then I was here last Cld Capt Grant
lived at the Soda Springs & his Daughter who had been at
St Louis 4 years at school had just returned home But the
Old Man is Dead & his large family of halfbreeds are scattered
where
I don't know XXIII - and every vestage of his Cabin is gone The Guard roused Camp this morning by a round from their
Revolvers in honor of the Day - After breakfast we had a
horserace - 2 males a horse & Pony were entered and the
"heat" reminded me of a "Slow Race" I once saw in CalHad Bread-Meat-Beans-Rice-Milk- & Pies - for Dinner
P.M. - 2 men from a train behind came up they had nooned
3 or 4 Miles back and camp^d for the night back about the
Springs - they have about 25 men 6 ox teams & about 600
head of loose Cattle they say they have lost a hundred head
of Cattle lately Today is very warm

Thursday 5 Still we Camp -- Old Brown got wrathy this morning and drove up his stock and pulled out from us directly after the Cattle train passed - Robt Forris & Wife who were along with him left him -- They had a quarrel & Brown drew his revolver & we had for a little time quite an excitement in Camp Uncle Jerry Fisher also left Brown & with his 2 horses stoped with Hamilton - The next excitement was a flock of Fellican flew over Camp & Several Shots were fired at them & one was shot & brot down next a large black Dagle visited Camp & was shot - wounded - & caught - & ended in a dog fight -- Day pleasant

Triday 6 Got up our Stock and were off in Good season We have seen nothing of our Escort of U.S. Drag & Cont

wait any longer in 2 liles we came to the forks of the road and took the California road (or Hudspeths Cut Cff) and had tolerably level road the sometimes rocky for 7 liles across the Bottom to the entrance of the hills here we turned up a wide Hollow & in a Mile began to climb the Mountain the ascent was about a Mile the Descent was long & easy tho sometimes rocky 1/2 Mile to a small dry Branch where we found some small timber then over rolling road I mile to a small stream of very good water (Wood & Crass plenty) We then had very rough road for 3 Miles (a large stream being about a Mile to our right) Down one hill was very long & steep rocky & sidling. Then we care to a fine branch 10 feet wide & 6 in deep from this we passed over a low ridge and had good rolling road 2 Miles & Campo on the Branch of a large stream (I suppose Portneuf River) the some call it Pannach River - This is the stream which we have seen for the last 5 or 6 ms Willows for wood Grass tol -- Made today 20 Miles 980

Saturday 7 Started early and left the river and turned to the left up a large hollow in 2 1/2 Miles came to the top of the ridge hill long but not steep then a along the ridge a short distance we began a long easy descent of about a mile & 1/2 to a large flat on a sloughy creek down this one 1/2 Mile & nooned good grass -- good water Sage At 12 M. moved on down the creek 1 mile and forded it & then struck for the Mountain over a high rolling 2^d Bottom in 1 1/2 Mile crossed a deep hollow Descent & Ascent steep & rocky & 5 Miles we

began to ascend the Mountain one mile mostly easy but quite steep & rocky towards the top -- The Descent was at first steep then more gradual but often sidling & rocky for 2 Hiles to a large spring in the hollow & in 1/2 mile we crossed a small stream runing eastwardly & camp^d Grass tolerable Cedar wood plenty on the hills near water good Made today.

17 miles

Sunday 8 started early in 200 yards crossed another small branch and began climbing upwards along a long hollow - Ascent very gradual & easy road good in 3 Liles crossed a wide flat divide & began a long descent down a ravine very easy excellent road 3 Hiles to a creek 1 rod wide good crossing then & miles over rolling country good roads to another Creek Hooned Grass Good Willows P.M. Crossed the Creek (Malade) and soon began to climb up a long hill & over rough Country 2 1/2 ms we descended to a ravine and traveled up it 3 1/2 Miles one mile of it was very rocky but the ascent was very gradual except a short pull just at the top -- then we began descending a very steep verry rocky hill after getting down part wex the road was very narrow - Then 3 1.5 more of gradual descent and good road brot us to a large bottom or flat when we found no water & very small sage here we campd Grass tolerable 1021 Made today 24 Miles

July

Monday 9 Started at 4 A.M. as we had no water for ourselves or stock - we traveled up the Valley toward the South 5 Miles and then turned to the right up a ravine good ascent and in one mile came to the top of the ridge the last 100 yards was very steep - then we had a very gradual and easy descent over rolling country 6 Kiles to a small branch runing mandar east here camp for Breakfast Good Grass - Sage This is the end of the 22 or 23 mile stretch without water P.M. crossed the Branch and traveled over rough rolling country 4 Miles to a large ravine and traveled up it 4 Miles (the ascent was very gradual and easy only occasionally it was rocky) to the summit of the it. then we descended in to a deep ravinc found a little spring of water but no good camping place & in 1 mile crossed another Summit & descended into a dry ravine down this (which was very narrow) we had good road for 5 miles still finding no water we halted and fed & got supper after an hours rest we moved on and in 1/2 mile came to a spring of Good water here we watered our stock & as the ravine was very narrow & no place suitable for Camp we moved on in one Hile we crossed the branch on a pole Bridge and in 1 1/2 miles found a Camping place and and stoped - some parts of our descent for the last 5 or 6 miles was rocky but enerally the road was good and the Descent easy 1049 Hade today 25 miles

July

Tuesday 10 Started early and traveled down the branch in 1 1/2 Miles we crossed a fork of it on a Bridge & soon anothe bad crossing in 4 from Camp we crossed it and turned to the left and traveled 11 Miles over a level barren gravelly plain covered with Sage Greesewood & Cactus this last was in bloom and presented a very gay appearance - then we arrived to the first fork of Raft River and nooned Old Brown & his crowd were nooning on the other side. P.M. Crossed the 1st fk of Raft River 1 1/2 rods wide & 1 ft deep Mudy & bad crossing & in 1/2 Mile crossed a bad slough then had level hard bottom road for 5 Ms to the 2^d Fk of Raft River (good crossing) 1 1/2 rods wide & 1 ft deep and in 1/4 mile camp^d the bottom immediately along these streams are covered with fine grass some willows along the streams Good Camp made today 20 miles

Hednesday 11 Started early Yesterday eve before sunset it began a drizling rain which continued with some hard showers tid sunrise this morning moved up the Creek 5 ms (crossing 4 or 5 small Franches) and crossed it and soon turned up a small Branch to the left it soon run out and we traveled up the Hollow and in 8 miles came to a small Branch and nooned Good Grass & willows. This was in a wide valley Rain from 10 to 11 A.M. P.M. Traveled across the right hand side of the Valley and in 5 Miles Crossed 3 or 4 fine small mountain

up a wide ravine up this 2 1/2 miles crossed over a small point and down into a ravine and crossed a small stream fringed with willows traveled up this stream 1/2 mile to City of Rocks - thro this 2 kiles good road then one kile thro a Gap to the Junction of this with the Salt Lake Road 2 Miles further over rolling Country good roads to a wide flat here we found good Grass & Sage and One Mile above the road water sufficient for Camp. Made today 25 Kiles

Thursday Microscopy 12 Started early traveled across the bottom 2 Miles and turned up a wide ravine and 2 MS came to Rock Springs on the right of the road there was a fine stream of water running down the hollow up further one mile to the Divide then a long descent then up a small ascent & down a long one and so on til noon 5 ms from the Summit we came down a very steep hill onto a Brauch of Goose Creek Good grass & willows & Water crossed this and 2 ms. over mixer hills some steep & rocky we came down onto Goose Creek & nooned Water & Grass plenty & good Willows P.M. Traveled up the Bottom of Goose Creek found good Grass all along it and plenty of willows in 7 miles we left the Creek & passed around a small Bluff and in 1 mile onto the river again and Camped on a fine bottom of Grass - Sage & willows Made to day 20 miles 1114

Friday 13 Started early and kept up Goose Crk Bottoms for 7 1/2 Miles - leaving the Bottom twice for a short distance - we then turned to the left up a small Branch and soon came up this was most of the way very rocky and to a Ranion in 2 Miles nooned on a small patch of Grass - Willows & Water plenty P.M. Moved on up the Hanion (Sometime very rocky) 1 1/2 miles & turned up a hollow to the left and soon began climbing the hills the first one was Very rocky both up & down & on top we then had rolling Country Sometimes rocky but gradually getting better til we came to 1000 Spring Valley Creek 12 Miles from the last branch - here we had rough roads up and down over the points sometimes rocky for 2 Hills and Camped near the branch Grass poor Water poor Cedar on the 1138 Bluff near Made today 24 Miles.

Saturday 14 Started early - down the Valley Good roads
7 miles then turned to the right over the Bluffs and for 2 1/2
Miles had roads sometimes rocky but mostly good to the Valley
again then along the Valley 3 Miles to some water which was
not good but fit for the Stock and in 1/2 Mile stoped to noon
Grass along the Valley Scarce & not good P.M. Moved on up the
Valley and in 4 Miles passed over a low ridge point and up
the Valley 2 Miles here we found splendid Grass tolerable Water
(Good but warm) and Campd Chips for Wood Made today 17 Miles 1155

Sunday 15 Started at 6 A.M. and kept up the Valley soon came to where the water in the branch was running & in a few miles found it to be quite a stream In 6 Kiles passed over some Marshy ground and in 9 miles crossed the Branch sides steep

& mudy - and in 6 Miles more came to some fine springs in a wide hollow where we enter the Mountain - Grass tolerable nooned (+passed hot springs but not in sight)

P.M. Moved up the hollow one mile and then up the hill 1 mile ascent good Descent long and easy then over rolling ground and still descending in 2 Mile came to forks of the road the right going down thro the Kanion we took the left and for 5 miles had easy road mostly descending to some good Water in the hollow to the left and Camp^d Grass Good - Sage - Made today 24 miles 117

Monday 16 Started in good season moved down the little valley a short distance. then took over the ridges for about 7 miles the road most of the way good - we then came down onto the Bottom again found a little water and moved down the Valley 3 miles and found water again and nooned Grass good -
P.M. Road left the Bottom and took over the Sage ridges for a mile or two then into the bottom &c Roads good after traveling about 2 1/2 hours a storm came up with wind hail and rain very hard but did not last long but as it had the appearance of coming on again we Crossed the Creek and Camp Creek lined with willows Grass good Water good when not stired up

1195 miles from Nebraska city

Tuesday 17 Started early one ox belonging to the train died last night - traveled down the Bottom over good roads

5 Miles and crossed a large fork of the River or as some say the Main River 2 Rods wide & 2 feet deep well lined with willows Crossing good then had 2 or 3 miles of sloughy road then good road again for 2 miles nonned on good grass & Clover

P.M. Moved down the Bottom over good roads about 3 1/2 oclock a storm of wind hail & rain which made us halt for 1/2 an hour then we rolled on and soon had sunshine & dust again after 12 Miles travel we camped late on fine Grass Willows & Sage Made today 23 23 miles

wednesday 18 Started early moved down the Valley over excellent Roads for about 5 or 6 MS to a Branch of the River 1 1/2 rods wide and 10 Inches deep - then the road left the Bottom and in the next 4 Kiles Crossed the Bluffs 3 times and onto a wide bottom Mr Davis has had some trouble with a sick horse - P.M. Moved on down the Bottom Sometimes thro the Grass & Wild Rye and sometimes thro the Sage about 3 P.M. a light shower made the horse teams halt but it was soon over Davis horse died (Killed I think by eating Greasewood from the appearance when opened) at 5 1/4 P.M. Camped Grass fine Sage & Willows Water Good Made Today 18 Miles 1236

Thursday 19 Started early (6 1/4) and traveled down the bottom good roads all fore Noon 2 or 3 Miles from Camp passed some Boiling springs close to the river and in 3 miles more passed a ford of River but still kept down the North Side at 11 A.M. stoped for noon Good Grass & Water -12-P.M. moved down the valley 1/2 mile then left it and took over the Bluff very steep long and sideling about as hard a hill to pull up as we have had once to the top we took down a long hollow then up another & so on till we came down in 9 miles onto a small valley and stream of fine cold water Down this 3 miles brot us to the River & camp Grass Good Willows - Mosquitoes plenty Made today 24 Kiles 1260

July

Friday 20 Started early and in 1/2 M. crossed a Brook l rod wide and in one Mile another half so large both excellent water and in one Mile left the Bottom and took over the Bluff the Ascent was long but Good most of the way in 2 Miles we descended to lower & rolling country - over this we traveled (roads sometimes rocky) about 3 Miles and then began climbing the Mountain again ascent about 2 Miles long but very gradual then along the Lountain top about 3 Miles we began to descend a wide hollow and in one Mile came to some springs of Good water and a little grass here we nooned P.M. traveled down the Bottom 2 Miles most of the way tolerable roads then the roads began to be rough and rocky and badly washed about the roughest and rockyest road we have had - in one mile we left the bottom and took over the hill roads still rocky & sidling and in 3 miles descended to the river at Gravelly Ford Grass Good Willows & Chips Day hot made 19 miles 1279

Saturday 21St Started early and in 1/2 L took over the Bluff for about 2 Kiles then down the Valley here very wide and covered with sage & greasewood the Grass along the river was confined to very narrow & marshy bottoms - 11 miles traveled brot us to where the River turned short South West here we nooned on Good Grass P.L. had for 3 or 4 Kiles Sage covered bottoms as this forenoon with a slough occasionally then the Bottoms became more covered with Grass as we approached a Creek which came down thro a wide Valley from the North, at 5 1/2 P.M. Camped (After Crossing several Sloughs) in a wide bottom of splendid Grass - Water from the

the Sloughs & not first rate Willows plenty - Mosquitoes

Do. Made today 21 Miles 1300

Sunday 22 Started very early - crossed several sloughs and a deep still Creek 2 Rods wide and 2 feet deep in the first 2 Miles - then had an alkali flat of 1 Mile to base of Mountain and in 5 Miles from camp we came to stony point where the road passed over a rocky ridge Point near to the River Then we left the River and for the remainder of the drive we traveled over an alkali Sage plain sometimes rocky - dusty all the time.

Day very hot - at 5 P.M. we arrived at the river again having traveled 20 miles without water Grass Good Water of River good but plenty of Alkali ponds on the bottom - Willows for wood Made to day 25 miles --

Monday 23 Started at 6 1/2 A M Last evening and thro the first half of the night and this Morning the Mosquitoes were awful There was no rest for man or beast woman or child all had to fight or be eaten - Bacon greese & were freely applied to man & beast cut it was but small relief & it was brush brush & swipe-swipe with no little swearing all the time. Traveled near the river one mile then took over a low flat Sandy ridge for 1/2 m then across a large alkali bottom some one to 3 ms from the river - with Good roads for about 10 Miles to the river again and nooned - Good Grass P.M. Just below campai the River made a short bend to the left and our Road this P.M. made a large circle around this and some distance from the River to avoid the sloughs several of which we crossed the latter part of the forenoon Drive in & miles we came to where the road left the River taking over the

point of the Mountain and camped Grass Good - Willows & a thrown off waggon for wood Made 20 mils 1345

Tuesday 24 Started before 6 oclock - and took the road over the Hill up a long hollow ascent nowhere steep but sometimes somwhat sandy Descent easy but sometimes rocky & sand in someplaces deep in 5 Miles we were into the River Bottom again but soon left it again for a short distance over allow rocky ridge the remainder of the drive was along the edge of the Bottom 12 ms from Camp nooned on bank of the River.

P.M. moved down the edge of the bottom here it was very low & wet often covered with ponds of Water & Bullrushes & flags &c Grass is scarcer and not so good as it was above - In 4 or 5 Miles the hill came one bluff to the Bottom and late we crossed several bad sloughs and in one Mile further Camped-Grass tolerable - Chips Made today 20 Miles -*****

Wednesday 25 Started at 6 1/2 and the veled down the edge of the Bottom and sometimes out in the sand hills to avoid the sloughs the last half of the drive sandy & heavy draging at 11 1/2 came to an open grassy place on the River and nooned Camping places are geting scarce generally the sloughs prevent access to the river and often the sand Bluffs come in intirely to the River -- Grass tolerably good P.L. directly after leaving camp we took up over the Sandhills - Sand very deep and heavy - for 4 or 5 miles the road on & off but mostly sandy then 2 or 3 miles of better road along the edge of the Bottom then 2 or 3 miles of sandy road at sunset came to a place where we could get into the bottom & camped grass good --

Thursday 26 Started at 6 3/4 A.M. and traveled down the Botom for about 2 miles to a ford of the River and where had been a Trading Post but now burned down Here we left the River Bottom up a steep Sandy hill and struck across a high Bottom Dry & dusty - white earth covered with Greesewood &c. 9 miles from the river we came to it again & nooned Grass Good. P.M. Moved down the valley about 2 Miles then over the Sand hills not very deep sand about 4 M2 and came down a steep hill into the Little Meadow down these over fine roads 2 ms and Camp - Good Grass - Villows Threw aside one Old Waggon & took one of M Davis Made today 19 ms 1404

Friday 27 Got our Waggon rigged and were off by 7. In 1/2 mile we came to the forks of the Road & Harlan and his croud and 6 of Davis Men started on for the Sink. while the rest of us took the Road for Black Rock Springs &c in 1/2 miles we left the Bottom of Humboldt and struck west over an upland plain gradually ascending in 5 miles we came to the dry bed of a Creek and followed up it into the Mountains 7 miles to Antelope Springs wherewe found Excellent Water Good Grass for Cattle but not good for horses -- Chips & Sage. Made today 14 Miles 116

short distance and then struck over some low points to the left for a mile and then up a long hill over this and we turned short to the left down a long hollow and in 4 Miles from Camp we came out, a large plain and turned to the left across the north side of it 6 miles brot us to the top of a long hill where we halted a few minuts & watered our Cattle from our Kegs then moved on down hill 1 mile we entered a gap in the Mt

& followed down the hollow 4 Miles often very rocky into a wider hollow which run to the Right down this one 1/2 Mile and over a point 2 1/2 M brot us to Rabbit Hole Springs - Some Water fit for stock drinkable for men here we stoped till night without Grass Lade today 17 Miles 1435

Commodore Smith we came today through a very rough country, sandy soil covered with wild sage this sage is a very curious plant. The only resemblance which it has to our common sage is in the smell of the leaves -- The plant is entirely different it resembles a small tree in fact it is the exact counterpart in miniture of our Burr-Oaks of Minn.




