

Fort Kearney Oregon Post March 30<sup>th</sup> 1879  
Mrs John Kimberley sir

I suppose from my long silence in not letting  
you know where I am that you think that  
I have forgotten my old fellow soldiers in  
arms but I embrace this opportunity of banish-  
ing that thought from your mind if you have  
formed one of that kind.

Since I last saw you I have enlisted  
in the Corps of Mounted Riflemen and  
am at this time about 300 miles in the  
Indian Territory from any white  
settlement but there is any quantity  
of Indians and Squaws at this post  
at this time for there is a tribe of  
about 3000 they are of the tribe of Pawnee  
their chief is Buffalo Hides and <sup>they</sup> are  
very ignorant and degraded we were  
some of us at their camp last night  
and looked around to see their manners  
and customs there is any quantity  
of Buffaloes in this country we have  
plenty of Buffalo meat to eat this  
winter we frequently see herds of from  
200 to 500 in a flock I do not expect  
that that we will remain here more  
than about one month more

We have marching orders for Oregon to start on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May which I think will be executed I cannot write as much as I would like for the Mail is expected to start in a short time at present I cannot give you a description of the Country you must give my respects to Charles Getzler and tell him that he may look for a letter by the next mail from this Post which will be in about 2 weeks I want you my old friend to send me some News Papers for it is as hard to get news here as it is in Mexico I must come to a close as I cannot get my letter in the mail quite soon and let me know how you and all of my old friends are and believe me your sincere friend and well wisher
