Journey to California, 1850

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[This is a record of the Jeanny of (Dr.) A. H.

Thomassen from St Jeanph, Missouri to Secremente Velley,
by overland route, April 28, 1870—degret 1, 1890.]

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Copied from original diary presented to California State Library by Mr. T. E. Glazier, December, 1961.

April 28th 1850

A. H. Thomassons Travles from St Joseph No to Calfornia to day at 11 oclock Sunday we started from the Bleffs Six miles from St Joseph cool and very windy we drave 12 miles about Six on astrait line and the brokenest perarie I ever saw we camped at a small branch which I name the winding branch we seen one dead horse

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April 29th outs and represent one of one temporal and the thrown if I stall a great the rest

this morning clear & cold wind blood hard all day & bright we travied 16 miles stoped at 2 eclock we et vitules that a dog would not eat the premarie was tottly burnt & the aches and dust blowed all ever our vetules as for our solves we looked like bogers if we had bin at home the dags would have baried at us our horses took astemped and was botherd some time before we got them name of mine got away I made a motion to stick a pickett stick in a small hale and crattle scale run his head out at me and I out his head off with an

April 30 this morning Clowdy wind very high & cold past 52 teems to day traveld 20 miles stepst at 3 colook we left the mains road and went in to the timbers & comped on the wright of the road on branch just as we got in to the timbers Mr Fletcher broak the conlines of his waggen windy dusty & cold all day very disagrable traveling all day

Wensday Eay 1th

This morning clears and cold very pleasant all day lay by all day and repard the waggen here for the first time we found pleasty grass graning our horses had fild themselves and took a small stam peed and four of them run about 1/2 miles and caut them with very difficulty we had fish for super this evening 2 of our horses quite lame to day 1 from the efects of kicking 2 days before

Thursday May 2th

this surning hazy and cool at 11 oclock commenced raning and rained modertly the Balance of the day past 12 ex waggons saw 2 dead horses on the road and one grave traveld 25 miles came to the big winson creek at 1/2 past two oclock we let our waggons down into the creek with laretts camped on the west side of the creek here we found grass very scarse it turned very cool in the knight here we had a good bad made of weeks.

Friday Key 3th

this mirring cloudy and very cool and very windy we traveld 3 miles come to small creek travial 5 miles came to the little winema here the teemes had to travial—1-1/2 miles aroun and 1/4 miles across this is a butiful cauping groun after we crost the creek and got on top of the hill look back the road is so crooked some of the teemes looks as the they was going back to day I picked up the skull of a man saw one dead horse we travied 10 miles came to a alk brouse here we still find grass very scarse the wind blend all day as hard as ever I saw it and very disaagrable traveling we went across the branch went down the branch 1/2 mile and camped

Seturday May 4th

this morning clear pleasant & com we travied 5 miles came to a branch planty wood & watter we com 3 miles came to another branch tolerable camp ground came 12 miles came to hig blick this Stream is as prity a stream as I ever saw planty timber butiful ford we travied 1-1/2 miles left the road on our left 1/4 mile and camped here we found grass little better wood very scarse saw 3 dead horses 2 graves on each side of the big blick very rocky the first rock we came to since we left St Joseph we organised to knight we have 39 men in our company at present our teemes consist of horses & mules to knight is the first time we have stood gard

Sunday May 5the
this morning win very high & coel

this day travel we past sevrel good camping places we travied 30 miles to asmall creek which I call turkey creek here we found plenty wood and watter but grass still scarse we saw 3 graves to day we seem one where the wolves had scrached the man up we seem some of his hare and bones I paid one tooth to knight and adminstered Cloriform charged 1 00 dollars killed the nurve of one tooth

### Monday May 6th

this surning clears and tolerable coul we seen sevral good camping places to day we crost big Sandy to day it is askell stress and butiful watter we camped to imight about 6 miles this side of the creek 1-1/2 miles to the left of the road here we found grass little butter planty of watter and it is as much as we can doe to get enuf wood to get our supers & breckfust we have travial 25 miles to day it has commenced raming a little to knight we past 7 graves today we past 4 on terms to day I stood gard to inight for the first time we could here the wolves howling round as Some of the company saw some buflows to day for the first time.

#### Tuesday May 7th

this murning cool and heary we traviced 20 miles to day we saw several good complex pleases to day crossed sevel structures to day intirley dry send 1/2 nee doop considerable of the road to day is very sandy we past 3 graves to day to height we camp on the banks of the little blies as prity little stream as I over saw to day there was considerable game seen turkeys door antelopes molves buflew we did not kill any our selves but a company from illnois kiled 2 buflew to day and sawn and sysulf went to there camp and got some of the most the first we over et

## Veneday May 8th

this corning cool and com tolerable pleasant all day we travled 30 miles to day I took a buflow kunt to day we left the road about 4 miles we took a considerable hunt but did not see any buflow but saw some 15 or 20 antalope I shot at one but did not hit it it mid! was too fure off they are the wildest and cummist

animal I ever saw we travied about 12 miles up the little bliew then we left the creek for 8 miles then we travied up it 8 miles and camped upon the bank of creek in our traviling to day we found grass very scree to day we seen in spots what is cald baflow grass some distince from the road it looks very much like bliew grass we seen where 2 baflow had bin kiled one of the company is old woolf and 2 pups after we stoped

### thursday May 9th

this marning clears and pleasant Dr Hathewess hers got away last evening and strade down the creek a man and myself looked for her until bed time but could not find her several of us went out this morning and found her in a short time we expected the indians had got her we did not each up with the wagness until they had stoped to came we took mother buflew kurt to day but did not see say of them I saw 3 antelspe 15 in one gang saw two wolves we took wulf chase and and (sic) one break his four leg but we could not sech him we sow where 2 baflow had him hiled this spring we saw a mans head to dry we supose it was a indicate head the reads is very dusty to day and the wormest day we had had sine we left the States we travled 20 miles to der travled up the blow 15 miles to day here the read leaves the blew and crosses to the platt we are about 21 miles from the platt we camped on as small crock to the loft of the road there is to have past great many wagrang yesterday and to day I could not casp in count of all they was such mixed up moss of them grass is very serse here and our feed perley exasted I think we willhave anuf to last us 5 to six day yet we indeed to stop at the platte and lay by until grass is good we will get there to morrow if we have good luck

# Friday May 10th

this morning hasy and pleasant remain so all day we traviled 25 miles we camp on the banks of the Plat to knight 8 miles below Fourt Carney this streem is the loost banks and the shalowest streem for the width that I ever saw we have camped epesite of the grand Iland 12 miles long 1/4 miles wide on this side it is about on this side of the river we have to pack it across on horse back little brusth] at that they say that is not eny for 300 miles up the river we past 2 graves to day we ceap our horses on the iland and gard them the river is not more than 1/2 leg deep upon a avredge and it dos not lack more than 3 feet of beigng to the tops of the banks

### Saturday May 11th

this morning clears and cool about 10 ecleck turned warm and remained so all day we lay by all day to day to day [sic] for diner we had prarie chicken and antelops for diner this evening for super we had buflow as tender as any chicken I ever et up to ten ocleck to day 960 waggons has past the fort up to 12 eclock to day the hole bottom as fur as I could see looked very much like waggons and drays crouding through as Sity I canot give ony idie how many there was for I could not count thin this evening the cooper county boys with males teemes camped clost by us.

Suiday May 12th

this morning closes and cold turned very warm after 10 soleck laby all day nothing of much importance ecurd to day

Konday Eny 13th man his balk has been about the state of the balk between the

this morning clear and cold at 10 colock turned very warn we travled 8 miles and came to fourt carney than came 10 miles which makes 18 miles fourt carney is a butiful situation the house with exception of two or three is sod houses every thing looks very clean and neat we camp about one mile to the left of the road to knight opesite of where we camp to knight the river is at least one mile wide there has bin great many waggons past the the [sic] fourt to I have know idio how many but several hundred

Tusday May 14th

this morning cleare and plesant to day we travled 18 miles and as prity a rode as I ever saw it is as level and smoth as a plank flour and the hold contry

around as far as you eyes will let you see is the same except a small brake in the bluff we only crost 2 little small brakes to day to knight we have to cook our supar with buflow chips here had to knight for super the pragree rabit for super they are much tender than the rabits we have in the Stats and about as large a game I measured its rears from pint to pint and it was 13 inches we past 2 graves to day we past a small streem cald plumb creek we did not cross

Weneday May 15th

this marning clear and pleasant we travied 22 miles past one dead horse rode not quite so level to day as usel past some 200 brakes the platt long here is about one mile and a half wide we are some times on the rivir and some times a mile from it the last 3 days for the last 2 days we have seen the the (sic) magnes on the specit side of the river in the rode lossing from council bluffs I puld a tooth of comm to day charged him 1,60 doller we past 32 magnes to dis marning before, they started past 6 ox tooms to day

Thursday May 16th the the same of the same and the same and the same of the sa

this morning hasy end pleasest bout 10 clock eleard off pleasest bellance of the day wind high we travial to day 16 miles the rod has himsessifing all day the bank of the river is much higher to day considerabley more brakes to day but rodd very good the much nervow to day than unial about one mile and 1/2 wide some of the boys came your vargine this evening some said it was a bridger and some said it was a grially have it had has every spareness of above in our days travial to day the bottoms opait of us is very nervow the bluffs high and broken

Friday Mary 17th

this marking heavy and tolerable pleasant Sun Shain out about 10 colock the wether changed Sevrel times through the day rained very little sevrel times through the day this marking we descend for sevrel miles very gragley the ballance of the day assended to day the banks of the river much higher the latter part of the day bottom much narrow the bluffs much higher and brokener here for the first time

I seen timber on the bluffs ocasionaly I could see a small Seeder cunsiderable more timber on the ilands to day than usul considerable seeder for the first I saw a little timber on the bunks on this side to day we crost seven very had brakes to day we could see very little timber ecasionly on these brakes we crost a little creek it was dry it is call ask creek nearley all of the greth is little ask we travled 23 miles here we found the best grass we seen sense we left the stats seen 1 cooking stove that was left

Seturday May 18th

this norming hasy and telerable cool about 10 ecleck very blowie today the buflow nats very bad to days travle the country such higher and brokener the low to day there is a second bluff to day they is a clew of very prity watter to day day [sic] runs about 1/4 of a mile to the right of the to read day we cross the south fork of the platt we camp to height 3 miles from from [sic] where we cross the river 1/2 mile to the right of the read neare a little slew the grass telerable good to day as soon as we crost the river we looked across the north fork which is about 6 miles to the bluff on the openit side we could see the hould bluffs covered with southing so covered of us started to see what they was we found it to be buflow we had a fine chase there was 7 kiled by crowd we have got lots of buflow meat we travied 20 miles to day

this marning cleare and placent lay by all day to day some of the boys 2 to baflow we have more buflow than we know what to do with I saw a skunks and one prarie rabit they can out jump any little animal. I over say

monday May 20th

this marning clear and pleasant travled we 31 miles to day this days travle the cuntry has quite different sparence 16 miles then we left the river then we travled 15 miles came to the river again the road has bin considerable broken to day her the bluffs in both sides seem clost to the river except asmall bottom

on this side where we camp on this side it is very broken and has very singlere looking spurence bluffs comming up on both sides with out asingle stick of timber except now and then a small tree of seeder at this place we had to wind down through the bluffs about 1-1/2 miles before we got to the river we got her about sundown seem waggens that was left sevral that has bin burnt

## Tuesday May 21th

this serning clears and pleasest we started at 7 solock for 10 miles the read was very bad considerable brakes and very sandy we stoped 1/2 past six we travial 16 miles we stoped on the river bank here we find grass very sorse I have for got to sention the watter we drink all the way up threw we have dug little holes we stoped at noon 4-1/2 hours in the banks of the river and got cool matter the river watter is very warm and mudy very much like the Miscouri river watter to bright it thusders and look very much like rain

#### Tousday May 22th

will 1/2 past five oclock to came 20 miles to day we past ever some very broken and werizon read to day the bigest parties of the read to day the sand was from 3 to 6 inches doop to day we past covered prety little Seeder groves considerable rock to day on the high borken bluffs great many of them looked as though they had bin laid there by hand we left the river again to day we travied about 2-1/2 miles them we came to ash hollow this hollow is annual valley of about 2 hundred yards wide it is about 2 miles long here the roads come to gether of the lower and uper fords of the South fork of the platt there is know other greath of timber here but ash that is afew scattering scruby looking trees it is sandy and gravley very little grass and watter to day we come to asmonwhent of indiens of the tribes of Sues they are as fine looking indiens as ever I saw we stoped there fore some time I was in there wigness I saw equan to knight grass fustrate the eldest indiens here I ever saw there was 36 wigness in the village the interpetur has

live with them for 12 years he has a Square and 2 childrin he sed if it was not for his children he would go to Calefornia but he ses he canot leave his children we past I very find spring to day which was great luxurey past I grave

Thursday May 23th

this morning clears and pleasant to day the roads has him very bad all day except now and then alittle solid road very dusty and disegrable travling the bettoms eregular to day some times on high ground some times low horses stand traviling much bitter in the sand than mules we seen 4 cooking that was left by the emegrants 4 wagges do 2 that as burnt up I have seen great rapy things that has bin draped on the road that I have not mentioned saws are buckets harness from of varies kinds we come to 3 indiens village the first 15 wigness 4 white men 240 wigwams 1 white mea 360 wigwams about 5 or 6 hundred indians we stoped just on this side of the 3 village at 12 oclock while our horses was grasing Sovrel of we want back to the village there is great meny curveitys to be seen amount these red sen of the forist those we pest to day is the Sues and Size tribe the perticulars is intendey too tedious to mention we seen I talirure goose I when saw we travied to dry 23 miles the grase to knight is very good past 1 grave we camp more the river to knight oppite of a pine grove some [sic] 6 or 7 miles on the blaffs to our left low scraby pine it atracts considerable attention as it is very enousen to see ony timber in this savege land

Priday May 24th

this morning the son rose clears but it soon cloudied up and and [sic] very little mist now and then until 10 colock cleard off very very last night about 12 oclock came up a think cloud wind very high and the hevest litning and all most without sesation it raised very hard for a abort time I expected every minute for our tent to be bloom away and to be left to the open plains the grove of pine I spoke of last evening extends up the bluff to our left 6 or 8 miles this marning in ashort time after we started we could see some pine or seder on the opsite side
